Bachelor of Creative Arts (Costume Design)

Bachelor of Creative Arts (Costume Design) (VET Pathway)

Gain a practical and theoretical understanding of the costume industry and bring characters to life through costume design.

- Study a degree that enables you to focus on both costume design and construction. Offered in collaboration with TAFE SA (RTO code: 41026).
- You'll have the chance to work on real-life performances and gain experience in production settings.
- Experience how the industry works via connections with other creative artists to get a taste of real-life collaboration.

Bachelor of Creative Arts (Creative Writing)

Prepare to work as an editor, researcher, writer, publisher or author with this specialised creative writing degree. You'll dive into genre fiction, learning from award-winning authors and industry leaders. Our creative writing educators are genre specialists across sci-fi, fantasy, romance and more.

- Study diverse genres and forms including romance, sci-fi, fantasy, literary, series, novels and short stories, and learn to design work for a range of audiences in relevant formats.
- Study in small, bespoke classes taught by award-winning and best-selling writers who are prominent in their fields and highly experienced in the publishing industry.

Bachelor of Creative Arts (Dance)

- Study diverse genres and forms (romance, sci-fi, fantasy, literary, etc; series, novels, short stories, etc) and build your degree based on your unique interests from across the creative arts, industries or broader University – e.g. Visual Effects and Entertainment Design, Film and Television, Costume Design.
- Be taught by award-winning/bestselling writers who are prominent in their fields and highly experienced in the publishing industry.
- Benefit from close ties to other creative cohorts (drama, film, etc).

Bachelor of Media and Communication

Bachelor of Archaeology

South Australia's only Bachelor of Archaeology will prepare you for a wide range of jobs in museums, government, community organisations and the cultural heritage management industry. Get your hands dirty and delve into the world's rich cultural history.

- Specialise in human evolution, ancient civilisations, maritime archaeology, historical archaeology or Indigenous archaeology at one of the world's leading archaeology departments.
- Study hands-on, learn archaeological field methods and undertake practical and laboratory sessions in our new state-of-the-art facilities.
- A series of international exchange links is available in the USA or UK for one to two semesters of study.

Bachelor of Arts

Build your knowledge base in the areas you're passionate about, develop the complex critical thinking and problem-solving skills required to solve some of the world's greatest challenges, and learn transferable skills that are highly valued in the workplace with a Bachelor of Arts. You'll develop world-changing, future-proof skills in a world that's changing fast. Become digitally literate, think outside the box and develop the skills to adapt and take advantage of new opportunities.

- Develop the complex critical thinking and problem-solving skills required to solve some of the world's greatest challenges.
- Select one or two majors from 24 disciplines and a minor from 29 disciplines, and choose from majors unique to SA universities including drama, law and society, archaeology, and innovation and enterprise.

Diploma in Arts

Not quite ready for a bachelor's degree? Enrol in a one-year diploma where you get to taste a variety of different topics in the humanities, arts and social sciences and learn the fundamentals of university study such as communication and critical thinking skills.

- This course can be counted as the first year of the University's Bachelor of Arts degree, so you can transfer straight into the second year of study if you choose to do so.

Bachelor of Languages

Understanding of a culture and knowledge of its language are in high demand. With the internationalisation of the job market, graduates with a qualification in a foreign language will have greater employment opportunities both in Australia and overseas.

- Choose from a broad range of languages in beginner to advanced levels. Study one or two languages from French, Indonesian, Italian, Modern Greek or Spanish. German, Chinese and Japanese are available via cross-institutional enrolment at the University of Adelaide.
- Potential areas of employment include tourism agencies, foreign language teaching, international trade, finance and commerce, diplomatic and defence agencies, translating services and international development.
- Flinders’ series of international exchange links give you the chance to study part of your degree overseas.

Diploma in Language

The Diploma in Language offers a solid foundation for learning and using a language of your choice, and will help you develop cross-cultural knowledge and skills that are invaluable in international workplaces.

- Develop strong language skills combined with a cultural understanding.

Fees and charges

As an undergraduate student your course is Commonwealth supported provided you're an eligible Australian citizen, New Zealand citizen or permanent resident. When can I start?

Flinders offers two admissions cycles each year for undergraduate degrees. Semester 1 starts in March. If you've decided to take a break from schooling, you may decide to start mid-year in Semester 2, which starts in July. Note that not all degrees offer a Semester 2 start, so check the relevant course page via:

Admission Pathways

Whether you are a school leaver or returning to study at a later date, there are many ways to gain admission to Flinders University. Explore your options and find the entry path that's right for you.

Year 12 entry

Most Year 12 applicants enter university via the traditional entry method, where offers are made to eligible applicants with the highest selection rank until all places in the degree are filled.

Guaranteed entry

If you achieve an ATAR equal to or above the published guaranteed entry selection rank (and you meet course prerequisites) you will be guaranteed a place at Flinders for most courses.

Year 12 Grades Entry Scheme

Upon SACE completion, by using three of your best Year 12 grades, you can gain a place in your course of choice. This is in addition to being considered on any other pathway for which you are eligible.

Indigenous Admission Scheme
